METHODOLOGY

Companies were distinguished as "Most Honored" for receiving two or more first-, second-, or third-place rankings in the combined buy-side and sell-side rankings in one or more of the following categories: Best CEO, CFO, IR Professional and IR Program.

In the midcap sectors, companies were distinguished as "Most Honored" for receiving the highest weighted score in their sector, wherein each first-place position in the combined buy-side and sell-side rankings is worth three points; second place, two; and third place, one in each of the four categories. Any tie in the weighted score is broken using each company's results in the underlying data.
